Why

2020 statistics show that:*

- 16% of all traffic fatalities were passengers in vehicles.
- 56% of the deaths of teenage passengers in passenger vehicles occurred in vehicles driven by another teenager.
- 24% of deaths in passenger vehicles (cars, SUVs, pickups, vans, and minivans) were passengers.
- 6,275 vehicle passengers were killed in crashes.
