The <u>Driver Education and Training Promising Practices: A Systemic Literature Review</u> has been published by NHTSA. The purpose of this research was to identify information gaps and key research questions related to the national standards <u>NTDETAS</u>. The primary research questions/issues identified related to three broad categories: the value of **blended learning**, the use of **deliberate practice**, and the application of **simulation approaches** to driver education.
