Sharing the road with trains can be tricky and doing it safely might be the difference between life and death! It is essential that the drivers know what trains can and can't do. They can't react, slow, or stop quickly and they cannot swerve. They are huge which gives the optical illusion that they are slow moving, but they are not always. If drivers do something that is unsafe or dangerous around trains, the consequences can be severe!


