In emergency response situations, seconds matter and precision is everything. That reality was on full display at the Utah HOSA State Leadership Conference on April 16-17, where two Hurricane Tigers, Joey Pectol and Iziek Stout, performed at the highest level in the state to claim First Place in the CERT Skills competition. The journey to the top step of the podium at the Davis Conference Center was paved with months of quiet discipline. Joey and Iziek spent countless lunches in the classroom running trauma drills and studying emergency response protocols. Their commitment had them spending hours staying after school, transforming empty classrooms and labs into simulated disaster zones to perfect their teamwork and technique. The CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) event is a two-round challenge designed to identify the next generation of disaster-ready health professionals. Joey and Iziek first had to qualify by taking an exam covering everything from fire safety to terrorism response. They scored as a top twenty team, advancing them to the hands-on skills round. Their top performance has earned them more than just medals; it's a ticket to the HOSA International Leadership Conference. This June, Joey and Iziek will travel to the Indianapolis Convention Center in Indiana to represent all of Utah against competitors from around the globe.
